ABSENTEE VOTING IN-PERSON

ABSENTEE VOTING BY MAIL

If you do not wish to vote absentee in-person, you may vote absentee by mail by following the steps below. *No return postage is needed but a witness* signature is required.

Step 1: Get an absentee application in one of two 1 -Online.

Go to SCVotes.org to request an application. You must be able to print your application.

Purfers (2003 E77 a 2010) By fax (803-576-2249 You will be mailed an application.

Step 2: Return the absentee ballot application as soon as possible.

You may return the application by mail, email, fax, or personal delivery to the contact information listed above.

Step 3: Receive your absentee ballot in the mail.

Step 4: Vote the ballot following ballot instructions and return it to the county voter registration office in your county of residence by 7:00 p.m. on the day of the election.

You may return the ballot personally or by mail. You may also have another person return the ballot for you, but you must first complete an authorization to return absentee ballot form, available from your county voter registration office.

DON'T FORGET TO GET YOUR BALLOT WITNESSED!

VOTING IN PERSON ON ELECTION DAY

If you plan to vote in person on November 3, 2020, please follow safety protocols to limit the spread of possible exposure to COVID-19. Practice healthy behaviors to protect yourself and slow the spread of COVID-19

Wash your hands before entering and after leaving the polling location.

While in the polling location, use alcohol-based hand sanitizer containing at least 60% alcohol frequently, especially after touching surfaces frequently touched by multiple people, such as door handles or voting machines.

Cover coughs and sneezes with a tissue or the inside of your elbow. Throw used tissues in lined

Wash your hands or use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer containing at least 60% alcohol.

Wear a mask. Children under 2 and anyone who has trouble breathing, is incapacitated or otherwise unable to remove the mask without assistance should not wear a mask.

Maintain at least 6 feet (about 2 arms' length) of distance from others. It is important to continue social distancing even when you and others are wearing masks.

Vote at off-peak times, such as mid-morning.

If driving to the polls and your schedule allows, monitor the voter line from your car and join it when it's shorter.

Frequently Asked Questions about Voting in SC

Q. Can anyone vote absentee in the 2020 General Election?

A. All voters are qualified to vote absentee in the 2020 General Election

Q. There is not enough time for me to comfortably return my absentee ballot by mail. What do I do?

A. You or an Authorized Returnee (complete Authorization to Return Absentee Ballot form included with ballot) can deliver your ballot to your county voter registration office by 7:00 p.m. on election day.

Q. Can I return my absentee ballot to my polling place on Election Day?

A. No. Poll managers cannot accept absentee ballots at polling places. Absentee ballots must be returned by mail or personal delivery to your county elections and registration office by 7:00 p.m. on election day.

Q. How can I check to see if my absentee application or ballot has been received?

A. Visit SCVotes.org to check the status of your absentee request. You can also find the status by contacting your county elections office.

Q. What do I take with me to the polls to vote?

A. When voting in person, you will be asked to show one of the following Photo

- A valid SC Driver's License
- · SC Department of Motor Vehicles ID
- · SC Voter Registration Card with
- US Passport
- Federal Military ID

HOW TO

Blank Ballot

After signing in, a poll worker will provide you with a blank ballot card and direct you to a ballot-marking device. Insert your ballot card into the ballot-marking device as instructed with the corner cut at the top right. If necessary, a poll worker will select your ballot style before leaving you to vote in private.



□ = Selections

Make your selections by touching the screen Selections will be checked and highlighted. To cast a write-in vote, touch WRITE-IN. A touchscreen keyboard will appear. Type the touch ACCEPT to continue voting.

Touch the ZOOM icon to make the ballot larger. Touch the CONTRA icon to change to high contrast white on black

Touch NEXT to move to the next contest. Touch PREVIOUS to return to a previous contest.





Review & Print Your Ballot

After completing the last page, touch NEXT to review your selections. The review screen will notify you if you have not voted a contest or selected fewer candidates than allowed. To change a selection, touch the selection to return to that contest. When satisfied with your selections, touch NEXT

To print your ballot, press the PRINT CARD icon found at the bottom of the screen. Your printed ballot card will be returned to you from the slot on the front of the ot-marking device.





Review & Cast

neview each selection on your ballot card. If you need to make changes, contact a poll manager for a replacement. When you are ready to cast your ballot, take your ballot card to the scanner and insert it face down on the green

The scanner counts your vote and drops your paper ballot into a locked ballot box.
